Lectures: In lecture, new material will be presented that will follow the text in emphasis. **All students are expected to attend lecture regularly.** In lecture, some exam questions may not be covered in the text but only if you miss a lecture, you should get lecture notes from a fellow student. Article Analysis: Over the course of the class we will be analyzing a number of articles covered. There will be approximately an article per chapter, 12 in all. 10% of the grade will be determined by preparing a short summary and analysis of articles. You must do 8 of the 12 articles. I will give a number of questions. Write a summary of the articles and answer the questions in paragraphs. Include relevant graphs if needed. The article analysis must be a page typed, double-spaced, Roman font, with 1 inch margins to receive credit. The summaries will be *due in class on the day we discuss the article*. **I will not accept e-mail summaries. Discussion is part of the assignment.**
